Eppure, a ben vedere, non sono pochi i punti di contatto con il mondo del cinema. Storie di ordinaria follia, Barfly, Factotum. Tre film di rilievo realizzati da registi a loro modo importanti (Marco Ferreri, Barbet Schroeder e Bent Hamer). Il cinema si impossessa delle opere di Bukowski e le restituisce in maniera originale, seguendo un percorso che si allontana dalla fonte letteraria e si avvicina agli intenti degli autori cinematografici. I libri di Bukowski diventano così il pretesto per una nuova analisi: Ferreri amplia il tema cardine del suo cinema, il tentativo dell'uomo moderno di trovare una via d'uscita alla crisi del presente; Hamer si interessa del conflitto insanabile tra artista e sistema, mentre Schroeder si limita a filmare in modo spontaneo le gesta di un ubriacone interessato più alla bottiglia che alla scrittura. Il risultato, per tutti, sembra uno solo: l'impossibilità di riprodurre il rapporto diretto tra vita e letteratura che contraddistingue tutte le opere di Bukowski. This is a compilation of interviews with motion picture crew members who worked during Hollywood's Independent Age of film and television production--basically from 1945 to 1980. A celebratory insiders' look at the Tinseltown machine, the project utilizes individual interviews, with rare crew photographs to provide the back story of production challenges and solutions for some of the world's most recognized movies. The Searchers, Chinatown, The Hustler, and Bullitt (to name a few) were done by the various people included in this book. It provides not only an educational treatment of the jobs and techniques of film making but also a dose of humorous and memorable experiences from the trenches. This book was compiled by a production hand with 30 years in the biz and is full of classic Hollywood fare.

Frederick Aldama's The Cinema of Robert Rodriguez (2014) was the first full-scale study of one of the most prolific and significant Latino directors making films today. In this companion volume, Aldama enlists a corps of experts to analyze a majority of Rodriguez's feature films, from his first break-out success El Mariachi in 1992 to Machete in 2010. The essays explore the formal and thematic features present in his films from the perspectives of industry (context, convention, and distribution), the film blueprint (auditory and visual ingredients), and consumption (ideal and real audiences). The authors illuminate the manifold ways in which Rodriguez's films operate internally (plot, character, and event) and externally (audience perception, thought, and feeling). The volume is divided into three parts: "Matters of Mind and Media" includes essays that use psychoanalytic and cognitive psychology to shed light on how Rodriguez's films complicate Latino identity, as well as how they succeed in remaking audiences' preconceptions of the world. "Narrative Theory, Cognitive Science, and Sin City: A Case Study" offers tools and models of analysis for the study of Rodriguez's film re-creation of a comic book (on which Frank Miller was credited as codirector). "Aesthetic and Ontological Border

Crossings and Borderlands" considers how Rodriguez's films innovatively critique fixed notions of Latino identity and experience, as well as open eyes to racial injustices. As a whole, the volume demonstrates how Rodriguez's career offers critical insights into the filmmaking industry, the creative process, and the consuming and reception of contemporary film. This book is both more and less than history, a work of imagination in its own right, a piece of movie literature that turns fact into romance.' Gavin Lambert was reviewing the first edition of David Thomson's monumental work in 1975. In the eight years since the third edition was published, careers have waxed and waned, reputations been made and lost, great movies produced, trends set and scorned. This fourth edition has 200 entirely new entries and every original entry has been re-examined. Thus the roster of directors, actors, producers, screenwriters and cameramen is both historical and contemporary, with old masters reappraised in terms of how their work has lasted. Each of the 1,000 profiles is a keenly perceptive, provocative critical essay. Striking the perfect balance between personal bias and factual reliability, David Thomson - novelist, critic, biographer and unabashed film addict - has given us an enormously rich reference book, a brilliant reflection on the art and artists of the cinema. How does coding change the way we think about architecture? This question opens up an important research perspective. In this book, Miro Roman and his AI Alice_ch3n81 develop a playful scenario in which they propose coding as the new literacy of information. They convey knowledge in the form of a project model that links the fields of architecture and information through two interwoven narrative strands in an "infinite flow" of real books. Focusing on the intersection of information technology and architectural formulation, the authors create an evolving intellectual reflection on digital architecture and computer science.

This book argues that 'deviance' represents a central issue in neo-Victorian culture, and that the very concept of neo-Victorianism is based upon the idea of 'diverging' from accepted notions regarding the nineteenth-century frame of mind. However, the study of the ways in which the Victorian age has been revised by contemporary authors does not only entail analogies with the present but proves - by introducing what is perhaps a more pertinent description of the nineteenth century - that it was much more 'deviant' than it is usually depicted and perceived. Deviance in Neo-Victorian Culture: Canon, Transgression, Innovation explores a wide variety of textual forms, from novels to TV series, from movies and graphic novels to visual art. The scholarly and educational purpose of this study is to stimulate readers to approach neo-Victorianism as a complex cultural phenomenon.

Il gusto per la citazione, i continui rimandi ad autori che hanno segnato l'esistenza dell'autore, la scrittura vista come terapia fanno di Caro Buk un pastiche quasi surreale, nel cui messaggio finale è racchiuso il senso del lavoro di Mincione: "[...] anche se la Vita non vale niente non c'è niente però che valga una Vita, bella o brutta che sia".

«La storia che mi accingo a raccontare abbraccia quasi metà dell'intera esistenza del cinema italiano, parte dal momento più alto del suo intero sviluppo e ne segue i fasti, le trasformazioni, l'avvicinarsi generazionale e le crisi che ne hanno reso difficile il

cammino degli ultimi decenni.» La parola più ricorrente in tutti i tentativi di osservare il cinema italiano dalla fine degli anni Sessanta a oggi è «crisi». Quello che era stato il decennio più innovativo per qualità, quantità, forme di sperimentazione, innovazione ed espansione della cinematografia italiana nel mondo, a un tratto cambia pelle, segna il passo, si frantuma. Mutamenti strutturali modificano economia, mercato, modi di produzione, modelli narrativi, tematiche e poetiche autoriali. Ma non è la fine della corsa. Décio Torres Cruz approaches connections between literature and cinema partly through issues of gender and identity, and partly through issues of reality and representation. In doing so, he looks at the various ways in which people have thought of the so-called cinematic novel, tracing the development of that genre concept not only in the French ciné-roman and film scenarios but also in novels from the United States, England, France, and Latin America. The main tendency he identifies is the blending of the cinematic novel with pop literature, through allusions to Pop Art and other postmodern cultural trends. His prime exhibits are a number of novels by the Argentinian writer Manuel Puig: *Betrayed by Rita Hayworth*; *Heartbreak Tango*; *The Buenos Aires Affair*; *Kiss of the Spider Woman*; and *Pubis angelical*. Bringing in suggestive sociocultural and psychoanalytical considerations, Cruz shows how, in Puig's hands, the cinematic novel resulted in a pop collage of different texts, films, discourses, and narrative devices which fused reality and imagination into dream and desire.
